Ordinance 2001-32, An ordinance rezoning a parcel of land on the SE corner of Liberty Street and Silica Road in the Village of Garrettsville from R-2 to R-1 (see attached legal description) amending the zoning map to reflect the change. Second reading.

Ordinance 2001-33, An ordinance amending Section 1135.02 of the Codified Ordinances of the Village of Garrettsville to add a definition for livestock. Second reading.

Ordinance 2001-34, An ordinance adding Section 1169.02(b)(10) to the Codified Ordinances of the Village of Garrettsville to add livestock as a conditionally permitted use in R-1. Second reading.

Ordinance 2001-35, An ordinance adding Section 1171.02(b)(10) to the Codified Ordinances of the Village of Garrettsville to add livestock as a conditionally permitted use in R-2. Second reading.

Ordinance 2001-36, An ordinance adding Section 1149.05(l) to the Codified Ordinances of the Village of Garrettsville. Second reading.

Moved Matson, seconded by Moser to approve Resolution 2001-37, A resolution adopting the plans re-decking the State Route 88 structure over Eagle Creek, including sidewalk, curbs and guardrail.

Moved by Klamer, seconded by Moser to suspend the rule that ordinances be fully and completely read on three different days and that Ordinance 2001-38 be put on first reading and passed.

Moved by Matson, seconded by Moser to approve Perrin Asphalt as low bidder for the 2001 Paving Project for the Village of Garrettsville and authorizing the Mayor and Clerk to enter into a contract with Perrin Asphalt. Perrin Asphalt bid amount \$85635.00.
