

## REGULAR COUNCIL

MARCH 14, 2007

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Craig Moser with Bob Matson, Dave Kirk, Chuck Klamer, Karen Clyde, Jeff Kaiser, Solicitor Mark Manlove, Clerk Nancy Baldwin, Ricky Neal and Rick Patrick. (Teri Eiermann arrived at 8:00PM.)

Moved by Matson, seconded by Clyde to approve the minutes of the February 14, 2007 meeting as presented by the Clerk.  
VOTE AYES-Unanimous

Moved by Kaiser, seconded by Clyde to pay the bills.  
VOTE AYES-Unanimous

Revenue, Expenditure, and Cash balance reports were reviewed.

Moved by Clyde, seconded by Kirk to suspend the rule that Ordinances be fully and completely read on three different days and that Ordinance 2007-17 be placed on first reading and passed.

Bob Matson told Council that the Fire Department is receiving a grant from FEMA to purchase fire packs. The grant is for \$93,000.00 and Fire Department contribution is \$3000.00.

Chuck Klamer told Council that the 2007 Sidewalk Project would be on the High Street and Center Street. Village residents pay \$10.00 a linear foot for the installation of sidewalks on their property. Chuck also told Council that the Chamber of Commerce has ordered wreaths and they will reimburse the Village.

Mayor Moser told Council that Steve Hadzinsky is now the Planning Commission Chairman replacing Dave Kirk who had resigned. Planning Commission is reviewing the Stanley Road property zoning change, cell tower and definition of family dwelling. The Income Tax increase will be on the May 8<sup>th</sup> ballot.

Rick Patrick told Council that the Chamber of Commerce is purchasing two more benches that will be placed on the Boardwalk. The Community Garage Sale is May 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup>, the Summer Fest Committee and Chamber are purchasing banners for the Festival and they can be changed and used for other events. The banners will be up May and June. Chamber is also looking at starting the Brick Memorial Program on the South Street entrance of the Boardwalk. The clock tower is in need of repair and the baskets have to be ordered by December

and Chamber would like to know what Council is going to do about sharing in the cost before they have to be ordered.

Karen Clyde told Council that she would like to see more security during Summer Fest.

Ricky Neal gave Council a letter from Sheriff Dwane Kaley about the Village joining the Drug Task Force.

The Village would have to pay \$7000.00 to be a part of the Drug Task Force and \$15,000.00 to pay an employee. Ricky Neal told Council that the funds from the Police Academy could be used to help pay the costs. Council would have to authorize Solicitor Mark Manlove to go to Court and ask the Court to allow the Village to transfer the funds from the Police Academy to the General Fund. Council agreed.

Moved by Matson, seconded by Eiermann to authorize Solicitor Mark Manlove to ask the Courts to release the Police Academy Funds to the General Fund and authorizing the \$7,000.00 buy in fee to the Drug Task Force.

Mayor Craig Moser asked Council to enter into Executive Session for reasons of pending litigation.

Moved by Matson, seconded by Clyde to end Executive Session and return to Regular Council.

Mayor Craig Moser read at statement to Council concerning Andrew Krcmar.

We, the Planning Commission, Village Solicitor, Mayor and Zoning Inspector, apologize in regards to the property at 8399 Center Street, owned by Andrew W. Krcmar. It should be stated that after review, Mr. Krcmar is in full compliance of the laws and ordinances within the Village of Garrettsville.

We apologize for any inference, which was made in regards to the legality of this property. Further we welcome Mr. Krcmar and his disabled tenants as part of our community.

Mayor Craig Moser asked to approve paying Andrew Krcmar \$350.00 and to acknowledge that Andrew Krcmar was in full compliance.
